SYMBOLS and GIFTS

We welcome you here in the blessed name of the Lord Jesus, Whose birthday we celebrate tomorrow.

Many things that we traditionally do or see or hear around Christmas time are symbols, and all of these symbols have a special meaning.

One of these symbols is the Christmas tree. This year we've decorated our tree with silver gift boxes to remind us of the wonderful gifts that God has given to us, and we're going to say a lot more about these gifts in the service.

At the end of each section the Leader will say -

The Christingle

The first part of the Christingle is the orange, which symbolises God's gift shown to us through His creation of the world in which we live.

From Genesis Chapter 1 :

God created the universe and when He had finished God looked at everything He had made and it was very good.

THE GIFTS OF CREATION

Gracious heavenly Father, we thank You that You have given us eyes to see the beautiful things that You have created, and voices that we might praise Your wonderful creation.

Let us, together, praise God for His gifts to us.

We thank and praise You, Almighty God, for Your wonderful gift of creation.

The second part of the Christingle is the four arms or fruits, symbolising God's love shown to us through His provision and His blessing in each and every season.

From Ecclesiastes Chapter 3 verses 1,2 and 14 :

Everything that happens in this world happens at the time God chooses.

He sets the time for birth and the time for death,

the time for planting and the time for pulling up.

I know that everything God does will last for ever. You can't add anything to it or take anything away from it. And one thing God does is to make us stand in awe of Him.

The first arm and its fruitreminds us of spring bringing new birth, spring flowers and lengthening daylight hours.

The second arm and its fruitremind us of summer bringing growth, summer flowers and longer daylight hours.

The third arm and its fruitremind us of autumn bringing harvest, falling leaves and shortening daylight hours.

The fourth arm and its fruitremind us of winter bringing colder days, rain, firelight and shorter daylight hours.

Let us, together, praise God for His gifts to us.

Thank You for all the changing seasons of our lives.

The third part of the Christingleis made up of a red ribbon that circles the orange.

From Acts Chapter 10 verses 34-43 :

God treats everyone on the same basis. Those who worship Him and do what is right are acceptable to Him, no matter what race they belong to. You know the message He sent to the people of Israel, proclaiming the Good News of peace through Jesus Christ. Then they put Him to death by nailing Him to a cross. But God raised Him from death three days later and caused Him to appear to us who ate and drank with Him after He rose from death. And He commanded us to preach the gospel to the people and to testify that He is the one whom God has appointed judge of the living and the dead. All who believe in Him will have their sins forgiven through the power of His name.

And so we place this red ribbon around the Christingle to remind us of the love Jesus has for all people and His willingness to die for each one of us.

We thank You, Lord Jesus, for Your sacrificial gift to us.

Let us, together, praise God for His gift to us.

We thank You, Jesus.

The Christingle and the Advent Wreath

As the last part of the Christingle celebrates the ministry of Jesus, so the last candle in the Advent Wreath stands for Jesus Himself.

The fourth and last part of the Christingle is the candle, which symbolises God's light that shines through the life and witness of Jesus and of all His followers.

So we place the candle in the orange to remind us of the wonderful light that Jesus brings into the lives of all who love Him and desire to follow Him.

Let us, together, praise God for His gift to us.

The centre and last candle in the Advent Wreath is called the Jesus candle, and as we light it now let us pause for a moment to think about all He means to us.

The Advent Wreath

The Advent Wreath is made up of a circle of evergreen leaves entwined around four candles with a fifth candle in the centre.

The evergreenrepresents everlasting life found in Christ; the circle of the wreath symbolises life without end; and the candles remind us of Christ as the light of the world.

The candle of HOPEreminds us of God's promises to His people and the hope we have in Jesus Christ and His promise of eternal life.
