And the grace to forgive.**



The *THIRD* step : REPEAT : I *HAVE* forgiven


– and when you're tempted to rake it up again –

Where did that come from ?

Rosamond Herklots, the author of this hymn, first had the idea of writing the hymn as she was digging up rocks in a long-neglected garden. As she dug up deeply rooted weeds that were choking out the flowers, she realized how deeply rooted resentments in her own life could destroy every Christian virtue, and all joy and peace, unless, by God's grace, she learned to forgive.

## But why should I forgive ?

Fight poisons : **RaGE, aNgeR, ArGuiNg, SLaNDeR, goSSiP, REseNtmENT, bITtErNESs, mALiCe, UnfORGivENEsS, gUiLT, HatE.**

with antidotes : *Peace, Calmness, Gentleness, Truth, Love, Forgiveness, Joy, Patience, Kindness, Self-control.*

**“I WILL forgive the past,  
I WILL forgive that person who hurt me,  
I WILL forgive the hurts of childhood,  
I WILL forgive myself for lost opportunities,  
I WILL forgive God,  
I WILL forgive whatever or whoever it may be,  
I TRULY WILL forgive.**

**I no longer want to live in this state of unforgiveness and hurt.  
Dear Lord Jesus, teach me to forgive, fill me with Your grace so  
that I may be a forgiving and a forgiven person.”**

RESOLVE : I WILL forgive. I WILL take this problem to Jesus and leave it with Him.

RELEASE : I FORGIVE.

REPEAT : keep on doing it.

**We invite you now to come forward and throw a ‘pebble’ in the ‘sea’ as a symbol of repentance and the desire to be forgiving and forgiven.**

*Prayerfully we sing.*

1. **Make me a channel of Your peace.**  
Where there is hatred, let me bring your love;  
Where there is injury, Your pardon, Lord;  
And where there's doubt, true faith in You:

2. **Make me a channel of Your peace.**  
Where there's despair in life, let me bring hope;  
Where there is darkness, only light;

3. **Make me a channel of Your peace.**  
It is in pardoning that we are pardoned,  
In giving to all men that we receive,  
And in dying that we're born to eternal life.

*Where did that come from ?*

John Newton was eleven when he went to sea with his father. Later he was impressed into service on a man-of-war, deserted, was recaptured, publicly flogged and demoted to common seaman. Finally at his own request he was exchanged into service on a slave ship. He was brutally abused, but ultimately became captain of his own slave ship.

He had long since given up any religious convictions. However, while he was attempting to steer the ship through a violent storm, he experienced what he was to refer to later as his “great deliverance.” He recorded in his journal that when all seemed lost, he exclaimed, “Lord, have mercy upon us.” Later he reflected and began to believe that God had addressed him through the storm and that grace had begun to work for him.

He decided to become a minister. He was ordained and accepted the curacy of Olney, Buckinghamshire. Newton's church became so crowded during services that it had to be enlarged.
