	They came to a place called Golgotha, which means, "The Place of the Skull". There they offered Jesus wine mixed with a bitter substance; but after tasting it, He would not drink it.
	They crucified Him.
ALL sing (si	How fast His hands and feet are nailed; His throat with parching thirst is dried; His failing eyes are dimmed with blood: Jesus, our Lord, is crucified.

	They gambled for His clothes as they sat and watched Him dying.

The Resurrection — Reading: Matthew Chapter 28 verses 1-9. Suddenly there was a violent earthquake; an angel of the Lord came down from heaven and rolled the stone away, and stood by the grave. His appearance was like lightning, and his clothes were white as snow.
